The health and safety of our students and staff are our top priority. This letter is to inform you that an individual(s) at Feather River College have tested positive for COVID-19 with the details noted below. - Up to 60 workdays of Worker's Compensation / Industrial Accident Leave
- Sick Leave
- Extended Illness Leave

• Other rights specified in the employee's collective bargaining agreement or applicable handbook

Retaliation or discrimination against any worker for disclosing a positive COVID-19 test or diagnosis or order to quarantine or isolate is prohibited pursuant to Labor Code section 6409.6(f).
