FEE NOTES:

1. Fees include Health & Transit fees which are \$17 per semester for Health fee, and \$1.50 per unit for Transit fee. Fees based on full-time of 15 units per semester (which is the minimum load needed to graduate in 2 years). California residents: \$36 per unit; Out-of-state & International students: \$235 per unit.

2. The breakdown for this category is as follows: books (\$909), educational supplies (\$234), course material fees (\$135), and computer-related expenses (\$378), excluding the costs associated with the purchase of a personal computer.

3. On/Off Campus includes rent, utilities, food, and household supplies.

4. Includes travel to and from parent's residence (for California and nearby western states) and transportation costs to and from classes and work (e.g. bus fare, gasoline, parking.) For students coming from a farther distance, such as the East Coast, estimated/average travel expenses for out-of-state students for two round trips from home to FRC are \$1000 can be added to the cost of attendance on a student by student basis.

5. Includes clothing, laundry, personal care, gifts, recreation, medical etc.
