Tuition and Fees

Required Fees

A. Standard Enrollment Fee \$36 per unit

This fee is established by the State of California, and is subject to change.

**B. Health Services Fee \$17 per semester
\$14 summer session**

The health services fee helps support campus health services, including limited student accident insurance. All students pay this fee during the fall and spring semesters.

C. Transportation Fee \$1.50 per unit

Ride the bus and do your part to maintain the pristine environment of Plumas County. This program was voted in by the general student body in April 1999. It entitles the pass-holder to unlimited service with the Plumas County Transit Authority. With this pass you can ride the bus anywhere it goes, not just to school and back. Schedules are available on campus and at www.aworkforce.org/pttransit. This fee does not apply during the winter session.

**D. Parking Permit \$20 per semester
\$5 summer session Daily Permits \$1/day**

Students attending classes at FRC Quincy campus must purchase a parking permit. (Parking permits are available for purchase at Admissions and Records.)

E. Nonresident Tuition \$199 per unit + \$36.00 per unit enrollment fee
(3.5 or more units)

Students who have not been legal residents of California for a full year prior to registration and who are enrolling for 3.5 units or more must pay a tuition fee in addition to the Standard Enrollment Fee. Students enrolling in less than 3.5 units pay only the Standard Enrollment Fee.

F. International Student Fees:

Orientation/Processing Fee \$25.00

Tuition \$199 per unit + \$36.00 per unit enrollment fee

International students must pay all required fees at the time of registration

(Note: Medical Insurance must be purchased or proof of insurance provided in English.)

Optional Fees

G. Computer Printing Fee \$5 per 100 pages

Optional payment of the computer printing fee entitles students to use the printers associated with the Academic Computing Network (printers connected to FRC computers). The college will contribute 50* pages when your account is opened; additional pages may be purchased throughout the semester in increments of 100 pages for \$5. The Computer Printing Fee may be purchased at registration or anytime during the semester. The Computer Printing fee is nonrefundable.

H. Credit by Exam Fee \$20 per unit

Students who are currently enrolled in at least one course and who have completed 12 units at FRC with a 2.0 GPA in all college units attempted are eligible to seek "credit by examination" in a maximum of two courses. Students will be assessed a per unit fee for credits earned by exam at the time of registration.

I. Withdrawals and Financial Aid

Students who are receiving financial aid funds must consult with the Financial Aid and Student Account Offices prior to withdrawing from school regarding refunds or repayments of grant or loan assistance received for that academic term. If a Title IV financial aid recipient withdraws from school during a Payment period, the grant or loan assistance received is subject to federal refund and repayment provisions. This also applies to financial aid recipients who are dropped from classes by their instructors.

FEE REFUNDS

If the balance is \$10 or more:

Student fee refunds for full-term classes will be automatically processed by the college for 100% of the balance minus the \$10 refund processing fee for full-term classes dropped through the second week of classes. No refunds will be issued for full-term classes dropped after the second week of classes.

Refunds for half-term classes will be automatically processed for 100% of the balance minus the \$10 refund processing fee for half-term classes that are dropped through the first week of classes. No refunds will be issued for half-term classes dropped after the first week of classes.

Refunds for short-term classes will be automatically processed for 100% of the balance minus the \$10 refund processing fee for short-term classes that are dropped prior to the first class meeting. No refunds will be issued for short-term classes dropped after the first class meeting.

If the balance is less than \$10, the amount will be credited to the student for the next semester. Credits not issued in the following semester will be written off.

The college will automatically process a full refund if the college cancels a class.

If You Are Taking An Online Course at FRC, *Please Read!*

No matter what online course you take, the first step is always the same. Contact your instructor by email as soon as you can after you register. Instructor email addresses are always the first initial of the first name, plus the last name, plus @frc.edu. So the email address of Jane Smith would be jsmith@frc.edu . You can get your instructor's name or email address from the faculty page on the main FRC web site at www.frc.edu , or from the Admissions and Records office at 530-283-0202 Ext. 600, or from the Instruction Office at 530-283-0202 Ext. 242 .

If you do not know how to use email, you should reconsider taking an online course. Although it may be possible to learn the computer skills necessary to take an online course, while you are taking a course, this will put an extra burden on you. You may fall behind in the class and have difficulty catching up.

Computer Equipment and Skills for Distance Education

Minimum Skills Needed

- Know how to use email, including sending and receiving messages, attaching and opening attachments
- Know how to browse the Internet (how to open web sites, use links, type in a web address, and use a search function like Google)
- Know how to find a file on your own computer (required for sending assignments to your instructor that you save on your own computer)

Minimum Computer Resources Needed*

- A Mac or PC no more than 5 years old, or that has been upgraded in the last 5 years
- A recent version of Internet Explorer, Netscape, or Firefox browser installed on your computer
- A DSL Connection, Cable Internet Access, Satellite Internet Connection, or other high speed Internet connection. You can take a course using a 56K modem but you'll need to be patient

All students should sign up for a free Feather River College email account. Most courses will require an email program such as Outlook Express (standard on PCs). Get the forms from Registration, in the library, or online at <http://www.frc.edu/information/services/forms.htm>

There are various tools used at FRC for online courses. Some online courses use web sites provided by textbook companies, some instructors create their own web sites. Many instructors use www.frc-online.com , the official web site for FRC Distance Education. You are not automatically registered into this site just because you have registered for class. You must go to the web site www.frc-online.com and create your own online account.

Besides the equipment and skills mentioned above, you'll need the following to create an account on www.frc-online.com and take a course:

An email address, preferably an FRC email account. You may not be able to access other email accounts while on the FRC campus
A course enrollment key provided by your instructor (used only the first time you enter the course)

To Sign On To Your Online Course:

1. Go to **www.frc-online.com** and click on the "Create a new account" link under the login box on the top right.
2. Provide whatever you like for a user name and password, and a working email address (use your FRC email address if you have one).
3. After you click "Create my new account," you should receive an email with a link in the message. Click on this link to verify your account.
4. Go back to the home page of www.frc-online.com and find your course by clicking on the appropriate "Course Category" on the left. This will display a list of courses in this area of study
5. Click on the name of your course.
6. Enter the enrollment key provided by your instructor. You should only need to enter it the first time you access the course. This should complete your registration in the web site and your course.

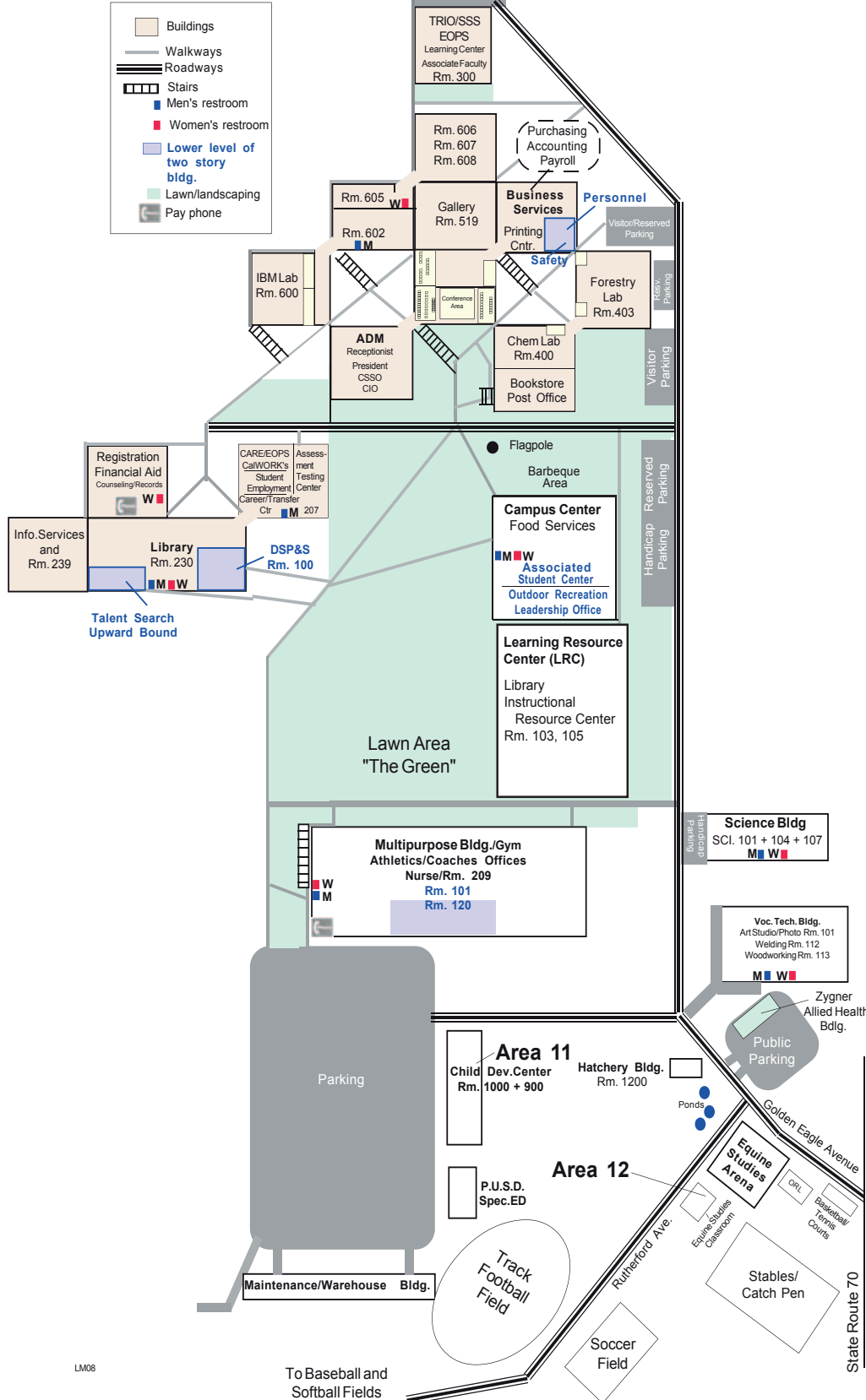
