

Parking & Traffic Regulations

Students using any FRC campus parking facility must pay a parking fee at the time of registration. The fee is \$20 per semester and a parking sticker is issued that must be displayed in the lower left hand corner of the vehicle windshield.

Students are allowed to park only in designated parking areas inside the lower campus parking lots. Do not park in visitor parking; students are not visitors. Do not park in any upper parking areas unless you have the appropriate parking permit. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas may be cited or towed away at owner's expense. The CHP routinely patrol the upper parking area and check the disabled parking spaces. They issue tickets that come with very large fines. FRC does not intervene in this process on your behalf, even if you have an FRC disabled permit but do not display it properly.

Parking is permitted between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on designated class days. Hours are extended only for special college sanctioned activities.

Parking or loitering on campus after 10:00 p.m. or after the conclusion of special events is prohibited. Overnight parking is prohibited without advance approval of the Business Office. Any vehicle left parked for more than 72 hours will be cited as abandoned and towed at owner's expense. In the event of a mechanical failure, vehicles must be removed from college property as soon as possible. Vehicle repair, other than emergency repair, is prohibited in campus parking areas.

All students are urged to lock unattended vehicles. Parking on FRC property is at the risk of the owner. FRC assumes no liability for damage or theft of vehicles or their contents.

Students are to adhere to all traffic signs and posted speed limits. Maximum speed is 15 m.p.h. All student-operated motor vehicles must remain on paved campus roadways. All wheeled modes of transportation (including all vehicles, bicycles, motorcycles, skateboards and roller skates or blades) are prohibited in buildings and my not be ridden on campus paths, walkways and grassy areas.

Students are allowed to drop people off at the top of the campus, but double parking or parking alongside the creek is prohibited. That includes checking your mail or picking up a paycheck.

FRC enforces traffic and parking regulations on campus by the authority granted by Section 21113 of the California Vehicle Code. Enforcement is under the jurisdiction of FRC and the California Highway Patrol. Violators may receive citations from these agencies.

Special permits are required for any upper campus parking. Information regarding special permits is outlined below and is available at the campus switchboard.

Disabled Student Parking: Designated parking spaces are reserved for temporarily and permanently disabled individuals with clearly displayed Disabled Parking Permits (FRC temporary permits and Department of Motor Vehicle issued permits). Any student who is disabled and unable to walk from the lower parking lots to the upper campus will be considered for a temporary three-week Disabled Parking Permit. Contact the DSP&S office for a Temporary Permit Verification form that is to be completed and signed by the disabled person's healthcare provider. The DSP&S office will process the completed form for issuance of a permit, if appropriate. Individuals needing a permit for a period in excess of three weeks, must apply for a State of California permit issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The Disabled Parking Permit:

- ◆ Does NOT guarantee or reserve a disabled parking space; spaces are available on a first come, first serve basis. Although FRC meets State of California requirements for the number of disabled parking spaces, the availability of these spaces may be insufficient at certain times of the day.
- ◆ Does NOT entitle you to park in the spaces reserved for wheelchair-only parking, unless your permit specifically designates this type of parking. ANY vehicle in a wheelchair-only parking space will be ticketed unless that vehicle is authorized to park in the space.
- ◆ Must be used only with the vehicle to which it was registered and is not to be used by anyone other than the individual it was issued to.
- ◆ Must be clearly displayed in the vehicle while the vehicle is parked in disabled parking spaces. If the permit is not displayed the student will be held responsible for any parking ticket received.

Parking citations will be issued for violation of this policy. The CHP can require proof of disability, so carry a copy in your vehicle at all times.

Visitor Parking: Students are not to park in visitor parking for any reason. Students are not visitors. Visitor parking is limited to 15 minutes without a permit. Visitor permits are available through the switchboard operator, located in the Administration Building.

Parking Citation Adjudication (Appeals): Citations may be contested within 30 days from the date of issuance of the citation. The policy and procedure for contesting citations is available from the Facilities Director, ext. 259.

The complete text of the Feather River College Vehicle Use, Parking and Traffic Regulations can be found in FRC Board Policy. The Feather River Community College District reserves the right to amend the parking regulations or restrictions at any time. Parking on the facilities is a privilege, not a right, and is subject to the rules and regulations as prescribed by District policies and procedures.
