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Concurrent Enrollment in College Classes BP 6172.1

The Governing Board desires to provide opportunities for eligible district students to enroll concurrently in courses offered at postsecondary institutions in order to foster individual student achievement, increase opportunities for students to complete college preparatory course requirements or career technical education preparation, and prepare students for a smooth transition into college by providing exposure to the collegiate environment. When it is determined that the postsecondary course in which the student intends to enroll is substantially equivalent to a course provided by the district, the student may receive credit toward high school graduation requirements in addition to credit received from the college.

Approval of Concurrent Enrollment

The Board may approve a limited number of students of any age or grade level to apply for part-time or full-time concurrent enrollment in a community college or four-year college when it is determined to be in the student's best interest and the student is adequately prepared for such coursework.

Upon recommendation of the principal and with parent/guardian consent, the Board may authorize a student to apply for attendance at a community college during any session or term as a special part-time or full-time student and to undertake one or more courses of instruction offered at the community college level. (Education Code 48800)

Within the enrollment limits and exceptions allowed by law, the principal may recommend a student for community college summer session if that student demonstrates adequate preparation in the discipline to be studied and exhausts all opportunities to enroll in an equivalent course, if any, at his/her school of attendance. (Education Code 48800) Any student's parent/guardian may petition the Board to authorize full-time attendance at a community college if he/she believes the student would benefit from advanced scholastic or career technical work that would be available. (Education Code 48800.5)

If the Board denies a request for special part-time or full-time enrollment at a community college for a student who is identified as highly gifted and talented as defined in Education Code 52201, the Board shall issue its written recommendation and the reasons for the denial within 60 days. The written recommendation and denial shall be issued at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting that falls at least 30 days after the request has been submitted. (Education Code 48800, 48800.5)

Steps to concurrent enrollment:

1. Meet with high school counselor or Principal
2. Fill out Plumas Academies course request form
3. Fill out an FRC co-enrollment permit, signed by high school Principal
4. Enroll in course at FRC, following all FRC processes and procedures
5. All expenses with concurrent enrollment are the responsibility of the student/family.
6. Upon completion of the course, submit an official transcript to high school office.
7. High school office notes course credit on transcript.

All students pursuing concurrent enrollment must have prior approval signed by the PUSD site Principal on the Plumas Academies course request form.

AR 5121 Students- Grades/Evaluation Of Student Achievement

Advanced Placement, Honors, and Postsecondary / College Courses

Because of the more rigorous nature of Advanced Placement, honors, **and concurrent postsecondary courses**, students receiving a grade of A, B, or C in those courses shall receive extra grade weighting as follows:

A (90-100%) Outstanding Achievement 5.0 grade points

B (80-89%) Above Average Achievement 4.0 grade points

C (70-79%) Average Achievement 3.0 grade points

D (60-69%) Below Average Achievement 1.0 grade points

F (0-59%) Little or No Achievement 0.0 grade points

I Incomplete 0.0 grade points

AR 5127 Students

To honor superior academic achievement, graduation ceremonies shall include recognition of valedictorian(s) and salutatorians(s). Valedictorian(s) and salutatorian(s) shall be selected based on established criteria and procedures that use multiple measures of academic performance.

Valedictorian and Salutatorian Criteria

In effect beginning August, 2016:

1. The student with the most grade points, weighted, shall be declared the Valedictorian. The student with the second most grade points shall be declared the Salutatorian. This determination shall be after the 8th semester. Each course only counts once. Only English, Social Studies, Science, Math, and World Language courses count towards grade points.
2. Grade points for regular classes are as follows: A=4, B=3, C=2. Grades for advanced placement classes are weighted as follows: A=5, B=4, C=3. Grades of D and F will not earn grade points.
3. Weighting for advanced placement grades will only be applied to on-site courses offered in the school (i.e. no online courses or off campus courses will be weighted).
4. The student must be enrolled the entire senior year in the high school to be eligible for these awards.
5. Only courses taken during the regular school year count toward this honor (i.e. no summer school).
6. Transfer students must take the same course requirements as all other Plumas County graduates.
7. In the event of a tie, the students will share the honor.
